

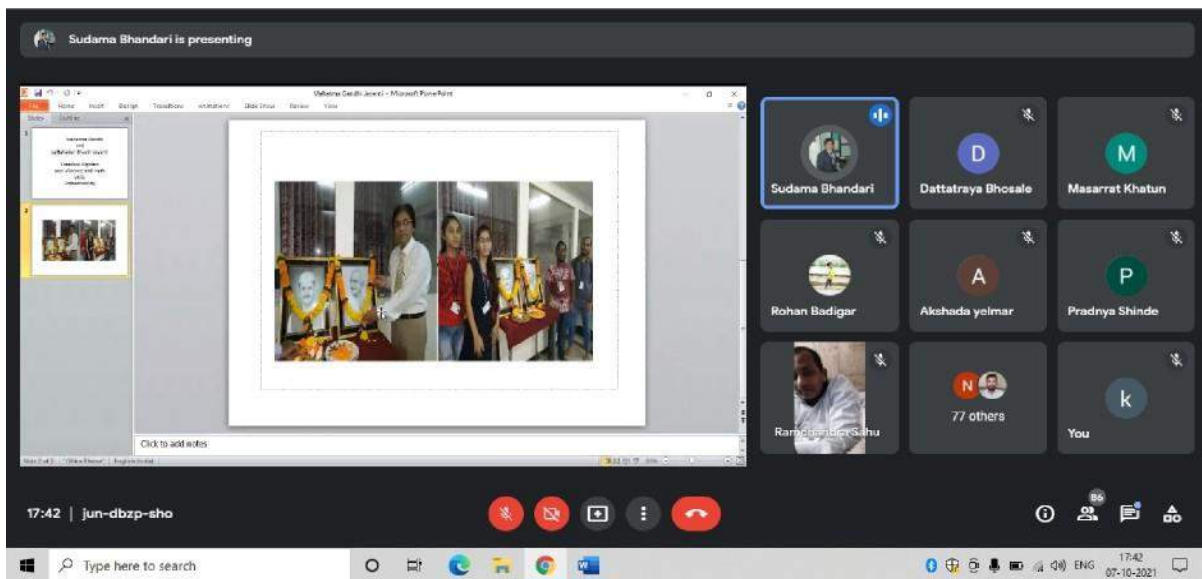

REPORT ON RASHTRAPITA MAHATMA GANDHI JAYANTI

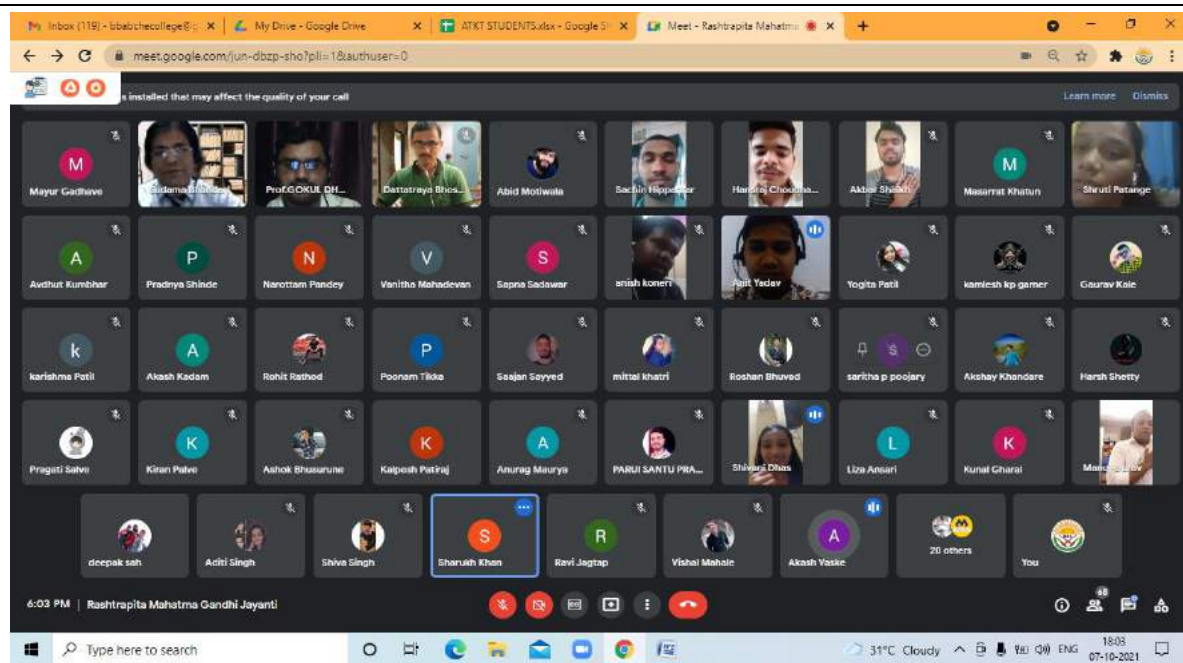

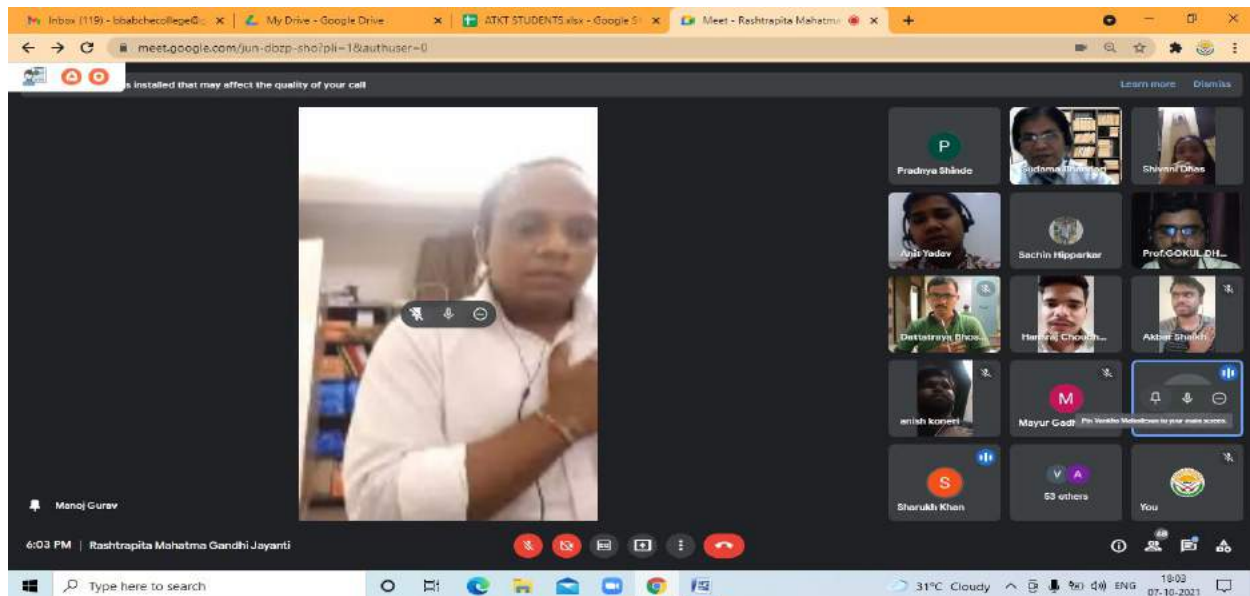
