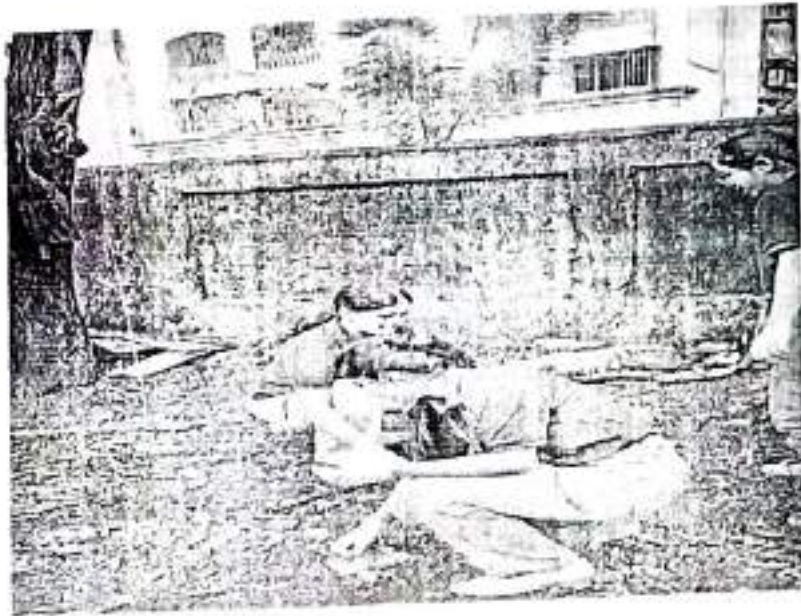

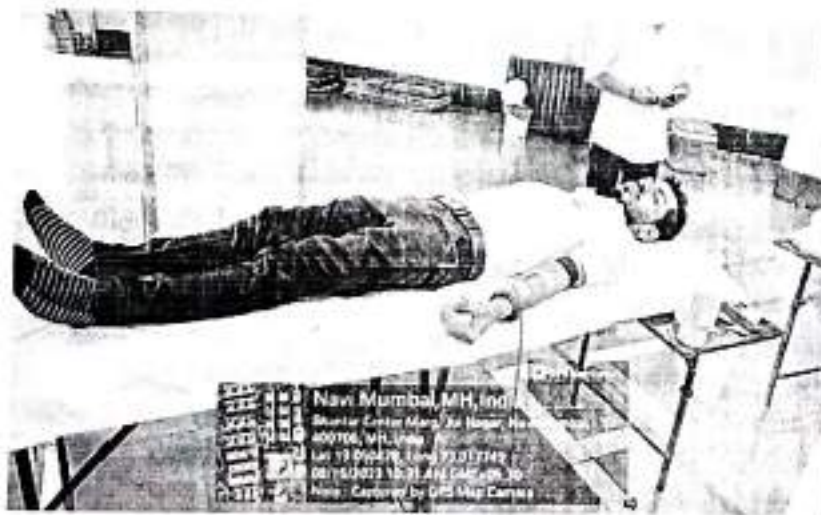
Report on Independence Day Celebration & Blood Donation Camp

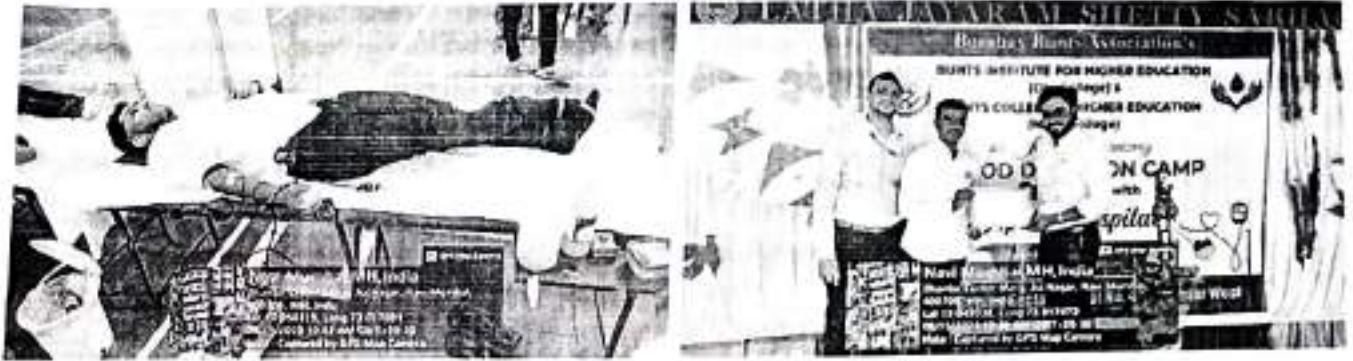

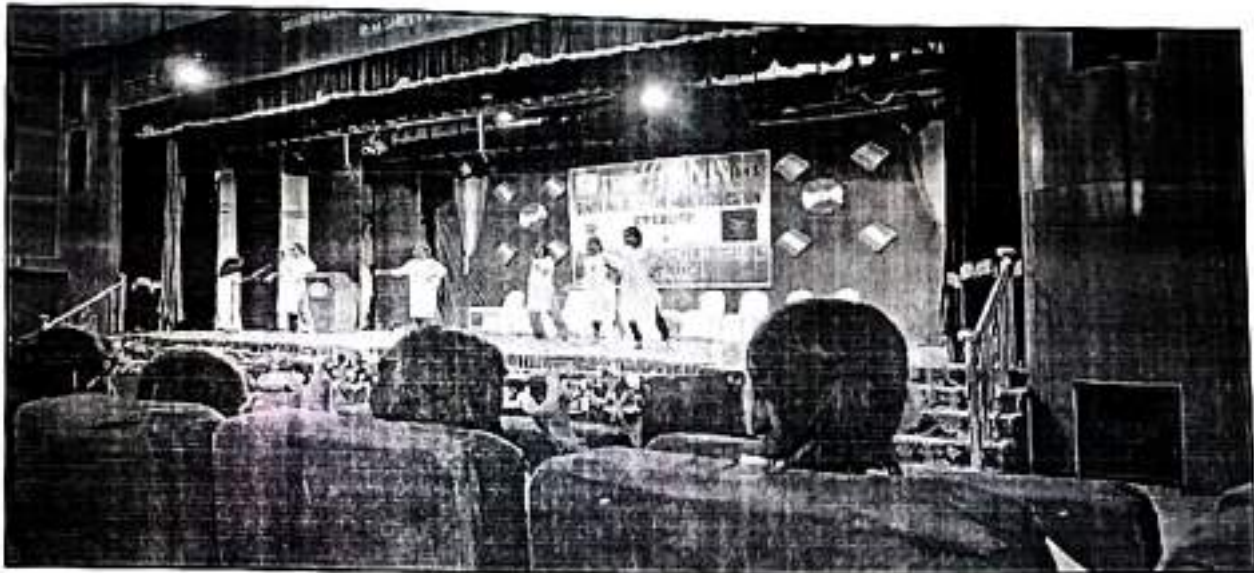
Report on 77th Independence Day

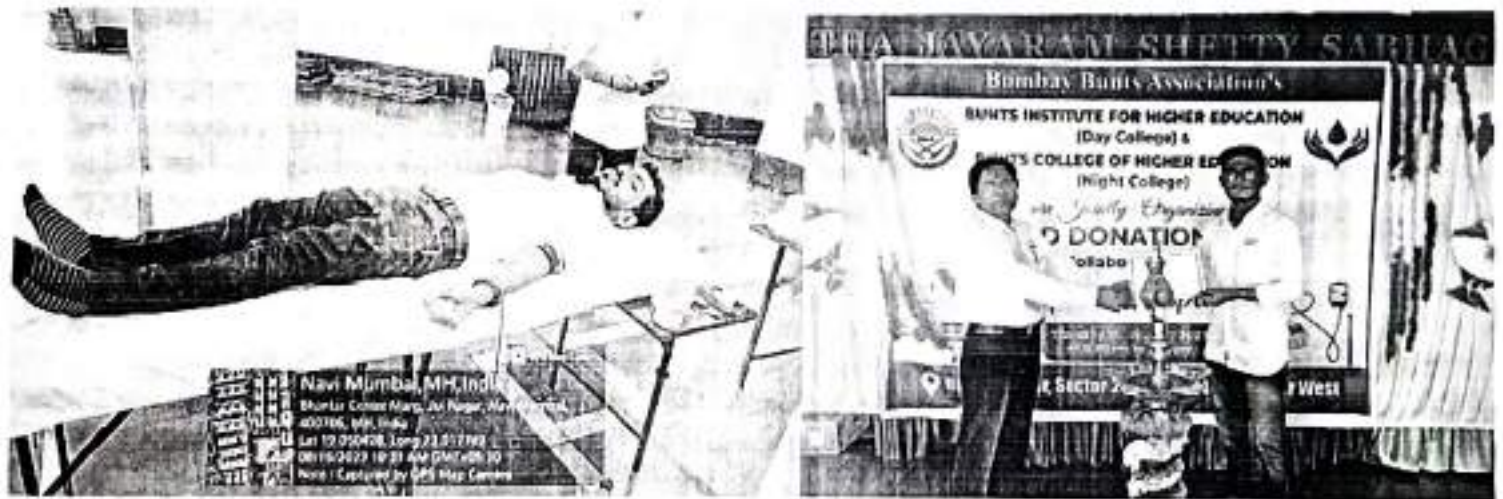
Report on Independence Day Celebration & Blood Donation Camp

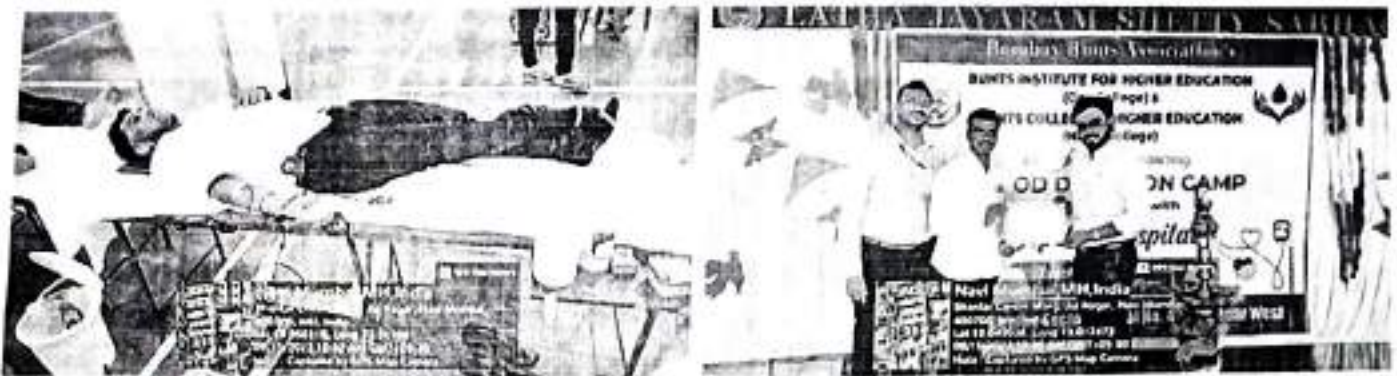
